


There are 606 ISCC certificates valid in NA. ISCC PLUS has the largest number of certificates

Update ISCC EU (I) – New and upcoming legislation

Implementing regulation on Voluntary schemes¹

- Legislation was published in June 2022
- Delegated regulations on rules for the production and GHG emissions of RFNBOs (renewable fuels of non-biological origin) and RCFs (recycled carbon fuels)
 - RFNBOs mainly refer to hydrogen produced from renewable electricity (e. g. wind, solar, water but not biomass)
 - RCFs mainly refer to waste processing gases and exhaust gas of non-renewable origin

Delegated regulation on co-processing (published in August 2023)²

 Co-processing refers to biomass feedstock processed together with fossil feedstock in an oil refinery into final fuels

• Revision of RED II (also referred to as RED III) (published on 18 October 2023)³

- Member States will now have until 21 May 2025 to implement the RED III into national legislation
- Delegated act on update of Annex IX RED II (final version pending)

Update ISCC EU (II) – Topics in discussion with EC

NUTS2 / typical GHG emissions from the cultivation of agricultural raw materials

- Currently new values confirmed by implementing regulations for Australia (canola) and Argentina (soy)
- · Confirmation of further new reports from a number of EU Member States and third countries pending
- EC to provide feedback on application of NUTS2 values

Auditor competence

- I.R. on Voluntary Schemes ((EU) 2022/996) contains accreditation/recognition requirements for certification bodies
- EC to provide feedback on how this will have to be implemented

Biomethane from gas grids

- Biomethane (as intermediate or final product) from gas grids may only be accepted under EU transport quota if a mass balance system is in place for the gas grid
- Currently, the EU interconnected grid is considered as one single mass balance system
- Option to use biomethane from gas grids of third countries in general possible upon confirmation by EC



Update ISCC EU (III) – What we do

- Update of ISCC EU documents to reflect requirements of I.R. on Voluntary Schemes
 - Updates include specified rules for the governance of Voluntary Schemes, for Certification Bodies and Auditors (audit processes, auditor qualification) and for certification (mass balancing, GHG, low iLUC risk certification)
 - ISCC will share the documents as soon as they have been confirmed by EC
- Update of ISCC EU guidance for co-processing
 - Certification process is adjusted to reflect the legislative requirements
 - ISCC will share the documents as soon as they have been confirmed by EC
- Ongoing digitalisation process/integrated IT solutions
 - ISCC HUB: Online platform for managing registration and certification related data of ISCC System Users (go live will take place at the beginning of December)
 - ISCC Transactional Database (implementation by the end of this year) that will also connect Systems Users to the Union Database (UDB) of the European Commission



Onboarding of Economic Operators into the UDB must be completed by the end of 2023

- ISCC is in the process of onboarding its system users. Currently we have almost 50% active Economic Operators (EOs) in the UDB
- It is extremely important to complete the onboarding process by the end of 2023 and to continue with the initial stock registration

- Measures taken to speed up the onboarding:
 - After two reminders, ISCC has formally informed the EOs that further lack of cooperation in this regard should lead to the temporary suspension of the certification
 - ISCC has also informed the Certification Bodies that it would fall on them to implement these sanctions, as ISCC cannot suspend or withdraw certificates
 - ISCC works together with the UDB team to correct wrongly entered data in the onboarding templates



In the past several months ISCC has been developing a Transaction Database in line with the UDB

- A platform, where ISCC system users can initiate their transactions, upload sourcing contacts and material uptake, convert materials, manage stock balance, etc.
- User friendly functionalities are reducing time and effort (e.g., csv upload of stock and materials)
- Functionalities in full compliance with the UDB requirements, therefore a direct connection between the ISCC Transaction Database and the UDB will be established
- First pilot has started to cover a supply chain from point of origin down to a biofuel production
- User manual and trainings will be provided to all interested system users soon



Following fraud allegations in the biodiesel market early 2023, ISCC reacted immediately and implemented a range of measures

- Allegations in the market since early 2023 regarding potentially fraudulent behaviour and unusual trade volumes in the field of biodiesel made from waste and residues coming from China to the EU market
- **ISCC has reacted immediately** with a range of measures leading, inter alia, to the withdrawal or suspension of certificates in China
- ISCC is working with authorities of the European Commission and the German Federal Office for Agriculture and Food (Bundesanstalt f
 ür Landwirtschaft und Ern
 ährung (BLE))
- ISCC takes its responsibility very seriously as a voluntary scheme. ISCC has continuously strengthened our system. Additional requirements have been implemented for the certification of wastes and residues supply chains
- Whereas a certification system can detect and sanction cases of non-compliance, it is **not a law enforcement authority** that can legally identify and sanction fraudulent activities. Nevertheless, ISCC contributes as much as possible to **make its certification procedures even more watertight**



The ISCC EU RFNBOs System Documents build the basis for RFNBOs Certification

- ISCC developed a certification approach for Renewable Fuels of Non-Biological Origin (RFNBOs)
- Approach is based on delegated legislations as published on 20 June 2023)*
- Successful pilot audits in Q3/22 that were initiated by the Dutch authorities EZK and RVO**
- ISCC submitted RFNBO certification approach to the EC for recognition in August 2023
- ISCC EU RFNBO certification audits will be possible, once recognition is in place
- The first ISCC RFNBO Training took place in May next training will be on 18 January 2024

Q&A implementation of hydrogen delegated acts

Version of 26/07/2023

In meetings with certifiers and volumps schemes, the Commission has discussed how hydrogen producers and volumity schemes could implement the requirements set out in the "HNBO delegated act" and the delegated act setting on the GHG calculation methodology for renewable fixeds of hological origin and recycled curbon fixeds ("GHG methodology")⁷. This document sets out questions that have been raised by fuel producers and certifies in the aftenetiant of the adopton of the delegated acts. The replice do not address any of the additional requirements in relation to the agreed revision of the rememble energy directive ("RED").

This report summarises the outcome of those meetings and does not create any enforceable right or expectation. ISCC provides certification solutions for emerging markets – Aviation and Shipping




- SAF can be (and is!) certified under ISCC EU, ISCC PLUS and ISCC CORSIA already today
